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Black and Latinx Marylanders are suffering disproportionately from COVID-19. The rate of coronavirus infections and related deaths is higher among black residents than whites or other groups, according to data from the Maryland Department of Health, which mirrors data in many other states and cities. Public health experts have long observed the disparities between white and black and other communities of color neighborhoods.
