4	the May Commission business meeting. Today's
5	conference is being recorded.
6	At this time I would like to turn the
7	conference over to Staff Director Mauro Morales,
8	please go ahead.
9	MR. MORALES: Thank you.
10	This is the U.S. Commission on Civil
11	Rights' May 18, 2023 business meeting. Welcome
12	all to the business meeting for the U.S.
13	Commission on Civil Rights, this meeting comes to
14	order at 12:36 p.m. eastern time on Thursday, May
15	18, 2023.
16	I am Staff Director Mauro Morales, I
17	will not substantively be participating in this
18	meeting, but because of the current absence of
19	the Chair and Vice Chair I'm administering this
20	meeting pursuant to my administrative function
21	set out in 42 USC 1975(b).
22	Is the Court Reporter ready?
23	COURT REPORTER: Yes, sir.
24	MR. MORALES: Thank you.
25	I would like to confirm the Commission

1	is present, and we'll take a roll call. Please
2	say present when I say your name.
3	Commissioner Adams?
4	COMMISSIONER ADAMS: Present.
5	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Garza?
6	COMMISSIONER GARZA: Present.
7	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Gilchrist?
8	COMMISSIONER GILCHRIST: Present.
9	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Heriot?
10	COMMISSIONER HERIOT: I'm here.
11	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Jones?
12	COMMISSIONER JONES: Present.
13	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Kirsanow?
14	COMMISSIONER KIRSANOW: Here.
15	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Magpantay?
16	COMMISSIONER MAGPANTAY: Here.
17	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Nourse?
18	COMMISSIONER NOURSE: Here.
19	MR. MORALES: Based on the response, a
20	quorum of commissioners is present.
21	COMMISSIONER ADAMS: Mr. Morales?
22	MR. MORALES: Yes? Who's speaking?
23	COMMISSIONER ADAMS: Commissioner
24	Adams.
25	MR. MORALES: Yes, Commissioner Adams?
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1	COMMISSIONER ADAMS: Because we're
2	very close to resolving all of the procedural and
3	substantive issues that led to the last two hours
4	or so of delay, I would move to adjourn this
5	meeting. So, we can finish those negotiations,
6	and reach an agreement, and confirm the chair at
7	the next meeting.
8	COMMISSIONER HERIOT: I second that
9	motion.
10	MR. MORALES: All favor of voting on
11	the motion oh, I'm sorry discussion of the
12	motion?
13	COMMISSIONER ADAMS: It's not
14	debatable.
15	MR. MORALES: It's not debatable, so
16	is there a vote on the motion?
17	COMMISSIONER ADAMS: Call the
18	question?
19	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Adams, how
20	do you vote?
21	COMMISSIONER ADAMS: Yes to adjourn.
22	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Garza, how
23	do you vote?
24	COMMISSIONER GARZA: No.
25	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Gilchrist,

1	how do you vote?
2	COMMISSIONER GILCHRIST: Yes.
3	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Heriot, how
4	do you vote?
5	COMMISSIONER HERIOT: I vote yes.
6	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Jones, how
7	do you vote?
8	COMMISSIONER JONES: No.
9	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Kirsanow,
10	how do you vote?
11	COMMISSIONER KIRSANOW: Yes.
12	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Magpantay,

18	MR. MORALES: Motion to adjourn fails.
19	The meeting will now come to order.
20	During the last business meeting Commissioners
21	requested time to negotiate an agreement on the
22	proposed AI16, and the Victims of Crime Timeline
23	and Discovery Plan.
24	Commissioners were informed that if

they could not mutually agree on agenda then

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1	there would be only one Item for the agenda, and
2	that would be the President's request to
3	designate a Chair and Vice Chair for the
4	Commission.
5	I've been informed an agreement could
6	not have been reached, as a consequence the only
7	item on the agenda is a discussion and vote on
8	the Chair and the Vice Chair. And of course,
9	Commissioners may add or remove items to the
10	agenda by a majority vote.
11	Do any Commissioners have amendments
12	to the agenda?
13	COMMISSIONER ADAMS: Mr. Morales?
14	MR. MORALES: Yes, Commissioner Adams?
15	COMMISSIONER ADAMS: You move to amend
16	the agenda to remove votes on the Chair and Vice
17	Chair.
18	COMMISSIONER KIRSANOW: Second.
19	MR. MORALES: Then we move to vote on
20	your motion.
21	Commissioner Adams, how do you vote?
22	COMMISSIONER ADAMS: Yes.
23	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Garza, how
24	do you vote?
25	COMMISSIONER GARZA: No.

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1	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Gilchrist,
2	how do you vote?
3	COMMISSIONER GILCHRIST: Yes.
4	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Heriot, how
5	do you vote?
6	COMMISSIONER HERIOT: I vote yes.
7	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Jones, how
8	do you vote?
9	COMMISSIONER JONES: No.
10	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Kirsanow,
11	how do you vote?
12	COMMISSIONER KIRSANOW: Yes.
13	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Magpantay,
14	how do you vote?
15	COMMISSIONER MAGPANTAY: No.
16	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Nourse, how
17	do you vote?
18	COMMISSIONER NOURSE: No.
19	MR. MORALES: The motion fails.
20	Any other amendments?
21	(No audible response.)
22	MR. MORALES: Okay, our first order of
23	business is noted in the agenda posted in the
24	Federal Register. We'll turn to a discussion and
25	a vote on the designation of Rochelle Mercedes

1	Garza to serve as Chair, and Victoria Francis
2	Nourse to serve as Vice Chair of the U.S.
3	Commission on Civil Rights, pursuant to the
4	request of President Joseph Biden.
5	I'll proceed to open the floor for
6	discussion. Is there any discussion?
7	(No audible response.)
8	MR. MORALES: Hearing none
9	COMMISSIONER HERIOT: Well, I'd like
10	to say something.
11	(Simultaneous speaking.)
12	MR. MORALES: Okay, I'm sorry.
13	Commissioner Heriot, please go ahead.
14	COMMISSIONER HERIOT: You know, we
15	have been trying to negotiate and I think we
16	got pretty close on how to do this. Again, it's
17	very important that, before a Chair or Vice Chair
18	be approved, it's important that certain ground
19	rules are laid. I think the things that we have
20	asked for which, and that is simply a
21	continuation of our long-standing policy that
22	each individual Commissioner can submit a
23	statement, two reports that are passed by the
24	Commission.

They have 30 days to do so, then those

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Commissioner statements are traded among the commissioners, 30 days to respond to other commissioners, and in extraordinary occasions — on extraordinary occasions — 10 days for surrebuttal. It's a very fair policy and I think we're very close to an agreement on that.

Our other requirement was that the crime report which was agreed to last year, part of deal where the conservative commissioners would agree to hold a report that the progressive commissioners wanted. That is a anti-Asian hate crimes, report on and the conservatives wanted a report in return for that on the impact of crime on minorities.

And all this was very fair and simply getting for us what had been agreed to earlier. Unfortunately, we were, I think, double-crossed on that report by the previous progressive commissioners.

We're not asking for anything that's out of the ordinary. And in fairness, I think, to Commissioners Garza and Nourse, they've been trying to negotiate with us on that -- it's complicated. And I think we can achieve an agreement, but we do not feel that we can vote in

good faith for President Biden's nomination until such time as we have an actual agreement.

And again, we're quite close, I requested of Commissioner Garza that we postpone this meeting, that we cancel the meeting for today, and instead deal with this when we have achieved that agreement. She informed me that the progressive caucus would refuse to do this, and that instead they would prefer that we take a vote, even knowing that they would lose the vote.

I don't quite see the point in that, but, you know, if others do, then fine. We can vote down the nominations, but I think that's a sad waste of time.

MR. MORALES: Any further discussion?

COMMISSIONER KIRSANOW: Kirsanow here,

I would reiterate what Commissioner Heriot has said. In addition, we appreciate the good faith that Commissioners Nourse and Garza have shown in trying to negotiate certain conditions with respect to this. And as Commissioner Heriot indicated, those were conditions that had already been in place. But, we were concerned because some of those conditions changed in the previous Commission iteration. So, we wanted to be sure

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we'd always have those particular conditions.

We are prepared to do the work of the Commission. You know, receiving SAC reports, hearing SAC reports, making sure that we staff SACs appropriately. You know name it. And I know that several of our commissioners have been examining various civil rights issues on their own, and we are eager to get about the business of the Commission.

However, we made a reasonable request think that this and could be done notational vote, for example. It could be done tomorrow, it could be done the day after that. And we're eager to have both, a affirmative vote on chair and vice chair. And also to be sure that the minority, or at least the nominal minority's interests are protected for all commissions moving forward, to have 3310 place.

And also, with respect to the crime report, that is as-is and it doesn't shift simply because there's been a dislocation or a change in the composition of the Commission.

COMMISSIONER HERIOT: I just -- (Simultaneous speaking.)

MR. MORALES: Any further discussion?

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COMMISSIONER HERIOT: One real quick
statement, and that is
MR. MORALES: Commissioner Heriot,
please proceed.
COMMISSIONER HERIOT: It's not just
that we're eager to get on the Commission's work,
we've been doing it. We've been working on
editing the current anti-Asian report, we've been
working on coming up with personnel for the State
Advisory Committees.
And what we're eager for is for the
progressive Commissioners to get settled in so
that they can help us out.
MR. MORALES: Anything further, any
further discussion?
(No audible response.)
MR. MORALES: I'll call the question
and take a roll call vote.
Commissioner Adams?
COMMISSIONER ADAMS: Pursuant to power
of 42 USC 1974(d), I vote no.
MR. MORALES: Commissioner Adams votes
no.
Commissioner Garza?
COMMISSIONER GARZA: Yes.

1	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Gilchrist?
2	COMMISSIONER GILCHRIST: No.
3	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Heriot?
4	COMMISSIONER HERIOT: I vote no.
5	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Jones?
6	COMMISSIONER JONES: I vote yes.
7	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Kirsanow?
8	COMMISSIONER KIRSANOW: No.
9	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Magpantay?
10	COMMISSIONER MAGPANTAY: Yes.
11	MR. MORALES: Commissioner Nourse?
12	COMMISSIONER NOURSE: Yes.
13	MR. MORALES: Vote is four-four,
14	fails.
15	COMMISSIONER ADAMS: Mr. Morales?
16	COMMISSIONER ADAMS: Move to adjourn.
17	COMMISSIONER HERIOT: Second.
18	MR. MORALES: All items are ended on
19	this agenda, so there's no motion necessary.
20	But, we adjourn the meeting. Thank you. The
21	meeting is adjourned.
22	COMMISSIONER ADAMS: Thank you
23	COMMISSIONER HERIOT: Thank you.
