13	meeting of the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights.
14	This meeting comes to order at 1:35 p.m. Eastern
15	Time, on Friday, June 16th, 2023. I am Staff
16	Director Mauro Morales. I am not substantively
17	participating in this meeting, but because of the
18	current absence of a chair and a vice chair, I am
19	administering pursuant to my administrative
20	functions set out in 42 U.S.C. 1975(b).
21	I would like to confirm the

19	A. DISCUSSION AND VOTE ON PRESIDENTIAL

21	GARZA AS CHAIRPERSON AND VICTORIA FRANCES NOURSE
22	AS VICE CHAIR OF THE U.S. COMMISSION ON CIVIL
23	RIGHTS
24	MR. MORALIES: During the last
25	business meeting, Commissioners requested time to
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agreement several negotiate an on items, victims of crime timeline and including the discovery plan, among other things. Commissioners were informed that if they could not mutually agree on an agenda that the only item for the agenda for today would be the President's request to designate a chair and a vice chair for the Commission. I was informed a few days ago and last week that an agreement could not be reached.

As a consequence, the only item on the agenda at this time is a discussion and vote on the chair and the vice chair. Commissioners with their authority may add or remove items to the agenda by a majority vote. Do any Commissioners have amendments to the agenda?

Hearing none, our first order of business, as noted in the agenda posted in the Federal Register, will be a discussion and a vote on the designation of Rochelle Mercedes Garza to serve as Chair and Victoria Frances Nourse to serve as Vice Chair for the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights pursuant to the request of President Joseph Biden.

Is there a second?

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COMMISSIONER GARZA: I'll second that.

MR. MORALES: We'll proceed to open the floor for discussion.

Is there discussion? I'll recognize any Commissioners who wish to be recognized.

COMMISSIONER GARZA: I would just like to say a few things.

MR. MORALES: Commissioner Garza.

COMMISSIONER GARZA: Thank you. Thank you, Staff Director Morales.

We have been negotiating over the last several months with our Republican colleagues. I would like for us to move forward with the work of the Commission, the important work of this Commission. The fight for civil rights is something that's very personal to me. It's something I've done throughout my entire career and I hope that we can honor this Commission and honor the American people with doing the good work and making sure that we move forward.

And we have negotiated on several occasions, including this morning. And unfortunately, it just doesn't seem like we can come to an agreement. But I am still hopeful. I am still hopeful that we will move forward and

continue the good work of the Commission.

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2 MR. MORALES: Thank you, Commissioner 3 Garza.

Any other Commissioners? Commissioner Heriot, please.

COMMISSIONER HERIOT: Yes, I share Commissioner Garza's optimism that we will still get through this. I do want to point out that the work of the Commission is ongoing. We are recruiting for SACs. We are working with OCRE to prepare for future -- we did for anti-Asian hate crimes report. We are doing research on concept papers. We are reviewing discovery requests and responses. We are reviewing draft reports.

So a lot of work is going on on the Commission and I think we could do much, much For example, I think it should be easy for the Commission, for a majority of Commission, to agree on bringing back State Advisory Committee reports before the Commission. There's no reason that that can't be done even if we haven't yet received, haven't gotten to an agreement as to chair and vice chair. There's no reason that we cannot have State Advisorv Committee slates present to us. We should be

doing that on a regular basis.

All four of the conservative Commissioners are eager to work on SAC slates and I'm hoping that we will be able to have SAC slates presented to us in the near future so that we can work them out and get that done.

I also believe that we are going to be able to get to a consensus on the chair and vice chair issues. It's taken some time, but I think we can get there, but there's no reason that these other issues should be put aside while we are working on that. The Commission can keep going. We don't need a chair or vice chair to receive reports from State Advisory Committees. We don't need a chair or vice chair to be working on slates for State Advisory Committees.

And of course, we're already working on the anti-Asian report. I have been spending the last several weeks doing pretty much nothing but working on the anti-Asian report. So the work of the Commission is ongoing.

MR. MORALES: Thank you, Commissioner Heriot.

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want the business of the Commission to continue to move forward and as a consequence of that, Commissioner Garza and Commissioner Nourse, the nominations are active and so it would not be appropriate for them to serve in a temporary capacity at this time. Our hope is that we certainly can come to some conclusion about this rule soon, but I certainly would like to make that as a motion for our Commission.

COMMISSIONER ADAMS: Second.

MR. MORALES: There's a second to the motion. It's open for discussion. I would like to comment when I have an opportunity.

COMMISSIONER ADAMS: Yes, sir.

MR. MORALES: This issue has come up. It was litigated in Federal District Court and as was pointed out by a Commissioner several weeks opined and responded ago, and Ι to all Commissioners that an acting chair, an acting director, staff are not allowed under litigation that occurred, probably what, 15 years ago, 20 years ago, I believe it was.

COMMISSIONER HERIOT: Say that again.

MR. MORALES: It was Ishimaru, I forget the first part of the case. It was an

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email I sent and so that -- this motion would be inappropriate because the court has already ruled and litigated this that no acting can be -- and it would undermine and thwart the statute which the President has a right to seek concurrence of Commissioners. And Commissioners have that right to make the determination. Unfortunately, right now, it's four-four and a tie fails. So I don't believe this motion is in order.

COMMISSIONER HERIOT: Mr. Staff
Director?

MR. MORALES: Yes.

COMMISSIONER HERIOT: I believe that case is about the President appointing the same person who has been rejected as staff director, appointing them and so it does not apply here. Our regulations actually speak in terms of acting chair. I don't think that case applies if I'm remembering that correctly.

MR. MORALES: I would disagree and we can provide -- I'll have General Counsel provide Commissioners with an opinion to discuss whether or not that's correct. But I believe the ruling, as I recall reading it, was pretty expansive, so I don't know if a Commissioner can be an acting

1	can appoint themselves when the President has
2	the authority under the statute. So I think it
3	would undermine and circumvent all that.
4	But again, that's my opinion, but we
5	can have general counsel opine and I can give
6	Commissioner's opinion in the next within the
7	next week on whether or not that would be
8	appropriate, but right now I would say it's not.
9	COMMISSIONER HERIOT: I'll call the
10	question.
11	MR. MORALES: Hold on one moment. As
12	you said, Commissioner Gilchrist has made a
13	motion, so there's a vote on that outstanding
14	motion. I believe you also mentioned that,
15	Commissioner Heriot.
16	So is there any more discussion before

21	COMMISSIONER ADAMS: Second.
22	MR. MORALES: There's a second. Any
23	discussion?
24	COMMISSIONER NOURSE: Was this on the
25	agenda? The Democratic Commissioners have had no

1 notice of these motions. 2 COMMISSIONER HERIOT: Well, vou had notice that this was an issue and you're the one 3 4 that keeps saying the Commission business --COMMISSIONER GARZA: Can we call the 5 6 question? 7 MR. MORALES: Any other discussion? Commissioner Jones. 8 9 COMMISSIONER JONES: Commissioner 10 Heriot, well, I know I can't address this to any 11 particular person, but I would love to know the 12 titles of those three reports. COMMISSIONER HERIOT: I think that was 13 14 in the email message a little while ago. Hold 15 on. 16 Okay, it was Algorithmic

Okay, it was Algorithmic Discrimination. That was the Connecticut report. Civil Asset Forfeiture, that was the South Carolina report. And Juvenile Justice, is that right, for the Texas report. I think these were ones where we're trying to make sure there's something for everybody here.

And I think I agree with all the people who have said that we need to move the Commission business along and this is one way to

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do that. This is a small way. There are many other ways that we're already moving Commission business along, but I see no reason for us to stop holding State Advisory Committee reports. That's part of what we do and I think we should continue to do it on schedule.

MR. MORALES: Any other discussion?

Commissioner Garza?

COMMISSIONER GARZA: Thank you for recognizing me. I find it really concerning that you will not vote on chair and vice chair that the President has designated under the statute, and yet, you want to introduce all of these other issues.

I think that it's really disingenuous because we know that we need to have a chair and a vice chair in order to move agenda items forward. And I find it really concerning, frankly, that you do not want to move on what the President has the sole power to designate and to circumvent the authority that the President has. So I just want to make that point. I think it is really concerning and I do think that we should move on.

MR. MORALES: Any other discussion?

1 COMMISSIONER KIRSANOW: Mr. Staff

Director?

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MR. MORALES: Commissioner Kirsanow.

COMMISSIONER KIRSANOW: Thank you.

Commissioner Garza, we're not circumventing the authority of the President. He has the authority

to make appointments. We have the authority

under the statute to vote up or down those

9 appointments and that's what we've done.

MR. MORALES: Any other comments?

COMMISSIONER ADAMS: Mr. Staff

Director?

MR. MORALES: Commissioner Adams.

COMMISSIONER ADAMS: The only reason we haven't gone to a chair vote affirmatively is because of the lack of fairness of the process to us. It isn't anything other than that. And once there's fairness, there will be an affirmative vote.

The State Advisory Committees have done work. Our job is to hear the reports and a chair or in the absence of a chair has utterly no impact on that process. And so we need to hear about the work that the Commission is doing and not put it on ice. It's really easy to hear

1	those reports. I'm not sure if the chair
2	designee has been there for these reports, but it
3	is not a heavy lift to listen.
4	COMMISSIONER GARZA: I would like to
5	have a point of order.
6	MR. MORALES: Please proceed.
7	COMMISSIONER GARZA: I'd like to make
8	a motion to amend this motion to add the vote on
9	the chair and vice chair as designated by
10	President Biden.

I'm going to say these reports once the State

Advisory Committees get placed on our website,

they're there at all times for Commissioners and
the public to see.

In my experience as a Staff Director for eight years, every single chair has brought forward almost every single month -- there have been a few months because of briefings or during the pandemic when the State Advisory Committee has not been asked or has not been available to present. We have had it every single -- and it's been a priority for every single chair that I've worked with over the last eight years. I don't imagine it would not be a priority for a new chair because the work of the State Advisory Committees is so critical to the work that the Commission does.

Creating your own agenda to circumvent a chair's ability to create agenda, I think is problematic because then we can start adding all kinds of things to the agenda that don't require a chair and it circumvents the statute, circumvents our AI, and so I would say this is not a route Commissioners should take, because

the information is available and we do have State Advisory Committees and we do have a number -- I couldn't agree with you more, Commissioner Heriot, that we have 11 State Advisory Committees whose authorization has expired that we need to reauthorize.

And so the work that all of you are doing is critical, but we do need a chair in order to create an agenda because it puts me in an intolerable situation where I can't create an agenda and then I have to wait for all of the Commissioners to reach a mutual agreement on an agenda. So then that's unfair to the staff. That's unfair to the SACs. And we should do it the proper way. We shouldn't try to circumvent this and create a new process that's never existed.

You're opening up a process that I think undermines not only the future chair, but other future chairs down the road. And I think that's unfortunate. So that would be my comments, but Commissioners, we can see how you wish to go, to proceed.

COMMISSIONER HERIOT: Mr. Staff Director, there's nothing unusual about a

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majority deciding what they want the next meeting to be like. You were calling for getting majority consensus on these things. That's what we're trying to get here.

MR. MORALES: Thank you. I think we need to proceed because my understanding is that it's 2 p.m. and our contractors, the contract has been exceeded and so we're going to need to move forward here. I'm sorry, but Commissioner Garza --

COMMISSIONER HERIOT: Right, to vote on the SACs right now. Okay, thank you.

COMMISSIONER HERIOT: Motion to amend.

MR. MORALES: Any discussion?

COMMISSIONER GARZA: We're discussing the motion to amend -- I made a motion to amend the proposal to have back hearings to add a chair and vice chair to this vote, okay. And then the next vote will be on -- depending on what happens, the next vote will be on the other issue.

I do have to say I just -- I am truly appalled by the desire to circumvent voting on a chair and vice chair. This is the third time. We've been in negotiations for three months. And we have been negotiating in good faith for months and trying to come towards an agreement. We offered what we believed was a really good agreement that was amenable to all sides and I was very hopeful for that.

1	So I am concerned about seeing what
2	this is devolving to and I hope that we will vote
3	yes on my amendment so we can move forward.

COMMISSIONER ADAMS: Mr. Staff Director, I'm informed that he initiates the process by circulating slates. It's much simpler and it certainly won't take two weeks.

MR. MORALES: That's not correct. That is absolutely incorrect. He has to find the applicants. We have to look through and get the applicants and then your special assistants get to go through and determine which ones that they want to allow on or which ones they want off and

1	that generally takes anywhere from 6 to 12 weeks.
2	So it's not true that it takes two weeks.

1	MR. MORALES: It's four-four. Motion
2	fails.
3	COMMISSIONER GARZA: I'm going to make
4	another motion to adjourn.
5	MR. MORALES: We don't need to make a
6	motion. All work is completed and we have no
7	more time for our contractors, so until next
8	month, thank you. The Commission meeting is
9	adjourned.
