Racial Disparities in Violent Crime Victimization in the United States Friday, November 17, 2023

On November 17, 2023, in Washington, DC, the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights will hold a <u>public briefing</u> to examine the federal government's role in collecting data and addressing racial disparities in violent crime victimization as an important dimension of the fair administration of justice.

We invite members of the public in attendance to address the Commission during an open comment session that will begin at 4:25 pm and run until 5:55 pm (ET), or when all speakers have addressed the Commission. Each individual will have up to five minutes to speak, with spots allotted on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Those wishing to speak can register both online and in-person at the briefing. The Commission will do its best to accommodate as many speakers as possible, but due to time constraints may not be able to hear from all members of the. Please note that seating capacity is limited. Persons with disabilities who need accommodation should contact access@usccr.gov at least two business days before the date of the briefing.
