District of Columbia Advisory Committee to the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights Public Briefings on Accessing Services for Students with Disabilities in D.C. Public Schools

The District of Columbia Advisory Committee (Committee) to the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights (Commission) is examining the accessibility and provision of services for students with disabilities in D.C. public schools. The Committee is exploring whether current policies, practices, and procedures restrict access to these services based on race, color, religion, sex, age, disability, or national origin, or in the administration of justice. The Committee has conducted two briefings and is hosting three additional briefings to take testimony from a broad range of subject-matter experts. After receiving testimony, the Committee will present its findings and recommendations on this topic to the Commission. Members of the public may also offer public comment during the May 2nd or May 10th briefings, but this forum has been set up to allow for those who cannot join during business hours to share their experiences with the Committee.
