District of Columbia Advisory Committee to the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights Announces Public Briefing on Accessing Services for Students with Disabilities in D.C. Public Schools

The District of Columbia Advisory Committee (Committee) to the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights (Commission) is revisiting its recent inquiry on <u>Accessing Services for Students with Disabilities in D.C. Public Schools</u>. The Committee will review the 2024 report's findings and recommendations considering recent changes within the U.S. Department of Education and their implications for special education services.

As part of this inquiry, the Committee will hold a briefing on Monday, June 16, 2025, to gather updated information and expert perspectives from a range of panelists. More details about this briefing are available here.
