The Louisiana State Advisory Committee to the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights will convene a planning and briefing meeting to continue planning a future civil rights project. The Committee will meet with and receive a briefing from representatives of the Louisiana Public Defender Board, Families and Friends of Louisiana's Incarcerated Children and the New Orleans Vera Institute of Justice to provide preliminary information concerning potential racial disparities in the high incarceration of African-Americans in state-operated prisons.

Congress has directed the Commission to establish advisory committees in all 50 states and the District of Columbia to study issues and forward advisory reports to the Commission on matters within agency's jurisdiction that reflect the views of the majority of SAC members producing the report.

The views expressed in reports are those of a majority of the State Advisory Committee members and do not necessarily represent the views of the Commission or its individual members, nor do they represent the policies of the U.S. government.
