CIVIL RIGHTS PANEL TO EXAMINE TREATMENT OF MENTALLY ILL IN WEST VIRGINIA

WASHINGTON, DC – The West Virginia State Advisory Committee to the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights will convene a public meeting to examine the treatment by the West Virginia criminal justice system of persons with mental disabilities, including persons who are intellectually and developmentally disabled. The Committee will examine the type of training provided to state and local law enforcement and corrections personnel in dealing with the mentally ill and programs to address mentally disabled persons in the criminal justice system.
