## Voting Rights in Maine

The Maine Advisory Committee to the U. S. Commission on Civil Rights is hosting a public briefing to hear testimony regarding potential barriers to voting that may have a disparate impact on voters on the basis of race, color, national origin, disability status, or religion in the areas of voter registration and access to polling locations.
