I write to share the attached [advisory memorandum](#), *Fines and Fees and Bail Reform*, from the Maryland Advisory Committee to the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights.

The Commission maintains 51 Advisory Committees - one for each state and the District of Columbia. The role of the Committees is to study civil rights issues in their communities and report findings and recommendations to the Commission. The Commission appreciates the Maryland Committee's focused attention on civil rights impacts of fines and fees and bail in the state.

The Commission requests that your office review the memorandum, which can be viewed in full at: <https://www.usccr.gov/pubs/docs/2018-02-26-Fees-Fines-MD.pdf>. The memorandum recommends (page 6) that the state carry out a comprehensive review of the use of parole supervisory fees and begin to collect specific information to enable effective analysis of the state's fines and fees system. In response to these recommendations, we advise that you take the steps necessary to protect civil rights in your jurisdiction. We have similarly asked the Maryland Administrative Office of the Courts to review the memorandum.

We would also invite you to view the Commission's 2017 [report](#), which similarly addresses the impact of targeted fines and fees on communities of color across the country.

The Commission appreciates your consideration, in the hope of ensuring civil rights protections. We look forward to hearing from you on what actions you will take in response.
