The California Advisory Committee to the U. S. Commission on Civil Rights is hosting an open community forum to hear testimony regarding federal immigration enforcement impacting California children. The Committee will examine (a) the impact of U.S. Immigration & Customs Enforcement (ICE) enforcement practices on access to public education for California K-12 students; (b) access to equal protection under the law for individuals based on their perceived national origin; and (c) the extent to which due process is denied to K-12 students and their families.
